# ADVANCES IN RHINOPLASTY

## About the Course

It is, once again, the pleasure and privilege of the Education and Research Foundation for the American Academy of Facial Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery to sponsor *Advances in Rhinoplasty*. This course is one of the world's premier rhinoplasty courses. It has taken place in Chicago and Boston previously with great success. The surgeon for each scheduled video will be available following the showing for questions and answers. This should further enhance the learning experience by increasing the access for the attendees to the faculty.

To finalize this great learning experience, there will be a cadaver dissection lab where supervised hands-on experience is available. This will allow for the application of some of the concepts and techniques learned during the course.

If you have not had the privilege or opportunity to visit the Northwest, now is the time. Seattle, Puget Sound, and the San Juan Islands are as beautiful and dramatic a location as anywhere in the world. The host city has endless opportunities for outdoor activity, fine dining, and cultural events. ## Registration
